Kāinga Ora and Spotless celebrate biggest ever group of young Mangere cadets

Seventeen-year-old sisters Tarial, Salote and Aliitasi Seuteni were busier than usual during the term one school holidays; they spent them getting up early and learning how to wire in lights and install ovens.

The sisters were among 35 youth, including five young women, recognised at a recent awards ceremony for their involvement in the Mangere Development Cadetship Programme.

Under the programme, Year 12 and 13 students from Mangere College, De La Salle, Southern Cross and, Auckland Seventh-day Adventist High School gain two weeks' work experience in a range of trade businesses that contract to Spotless, a Downer company. Cadets work with plumbers, electricians, painters and carpenters.

Kāinga Ora Community Connector John Kumitau said the cadetship was designed to give Mangere youth exposure to different vocations and career advice, encourage employment and build confidence, as well as provide a proactive activity for the holidays.

BUILDING FOR THE FUTURE

Cejaye Ikuia has known she wanted to work in the construction industry since she learned wood technology back at Intermediate School. Like eight other young people across Auckland, the 17-year-old jumped at the opportunity to wear work boots and a hard hat and spend her school holidays on a building site, through the Kāinga Ora Construction Plus programme.

Construction Plus helps local communities impacted by urban development by connecting people with training, employment and industry opportunities across Auckland and New Zealand. The scheme is also designed to engage communities with large scale developments in their area. This April, students worked in Oranga, Mangere West, Ōwairaka, Hobsonville and Roskill South developments where Piritahi, the civil works alliance for Kāinga Ora, is currently preparing the land for building.

Cejaye and her friend Abigail Panuve, both from Mangere College, filled their days at the Mangere West site digging gravel and creating a silt fence to manage storm-water. Although both students were a little nervous at the start, they say the experience was a positive one, and they particularly enjoyed being part of a team.

Since it was established in November 2019, 126 people have been engaged through Construction Plus. Of these, 66 have gone on to become employed.

Construction Plus Manager Nigel Chandra says the various site managers were all impressed by students' work ethic and the programme continues to be a success, reinforcing Kāinga Ora values of working closely with other organisations (Mahi Tahi), supporting our communities (Manaakitanga), and trying new ways of supporting workforce development – or being bold (Whanake). Congratulations to all the students who took part!

Tararata Creek planting day success

The rain held off for a record turnout of volunteers at the Community Planting Day hosted by the Tararata Stream Team last month. The day was dedicated to help the Tararata Stream Team with native tree and shrub planting and litter clean-up. The groups hard work was followed by a welldeserved BBQ lunch. A big thank you to everyone from the community and the Kāinga Ora and Mangere Development teams who turned up to help on the day!











PLANTING IN PROGRESS PLEASE DON'T DISTURB THE TREES

Local groups have been working hard to regenerate this area. They've done this important work with native planting, pest control, water monitoring, bush regeneration, and by constructing fish reserves. This work helps our wildlife to thrive!

Native planting helps to:

- » increase the variety of plants in the area
- » provide shade for the longfin eel and inanga (one of Auckland's 5 whitebait species) that reside in the creek
- » reduce erosion of the stream banks
- » increase tree canopy cover
- » treat stormwater before it reaches the creek.

HELP US TO REGENERATE TARARATA CREEK

The long-term health of our creek is dependent on all of us helping to protect it. Please do not throw litter into the creek or disrupt native planting. If you see anyone vandalising the area you can report it to the police by quoting #210610/4258.

MANGERE WEST PROGRESS UPDATE

Stage 1 development on the southern side of Tararata Creek is well underway with the civil works expected to be completed by the end of the year.

- » 80 new state homes have been completed and occupied, and a further 61 new state homes will be underway as part of Stage 1 by the end of the year.
- » The first market and affordable (KiwiBuild) homes are now under construction with the first homes expected to be completed by the end of the year.
- » We're expecting to be underway with 165 new market and affordable homes by the end of the year in Stage 1.

Stage 2 development is progressing well on the northern side of Tararata Creek with civil works expected to complete early 2022.

- » State housing construction has commenced in July 2021. Approximately 58 new state homes will be underway as part of Stage 2 by the end of the year.
- » Stage 2 will involve the delivery of 131 new market and affordable homes. The first of these homes will be under construction in early 2022.

Infrastructure upgrades are now underway

We're upgrading the infrastructure in the neighbourhood to support the delivery of more warm, dry homes to the area. This involves upgrading water supply, stormwater and wastewater pipes, and where necessary upgrading and repairing the road surface and curbs to better serve the needs of existing and future residents. In time, we will also be adding new streetlights and street trees (along the berm) where possible. The stormwater work is to address existing drainage issues at Tararata Creek while minimising ecological impacts on the waterway, and reduce the impact of surface-flooding on some properties in the neighbourhood.

We know this work can be disruptive and are committed to being good neighbours, ensuring we support the wellbeing of residents throughout the construction process. If you have any questions about the civil works happening on your street please feel free to contact Piritahi:






TIMELINE

Winter/Spring 2021

- » Stage 1 & 2 civil works continues
- » Construction of new state homes along Bader Drive continues
- » Construction of first affordable & market houses along Cessna Place and Ventura St begins
- » Construction of new state homes along Elmdon Street and Molesworth Place begins
- » Construction of widened walkway from Eldon Street to Welby Place

Summer 2021/22

- » Stage 1 & 2 civil works complete
- » Construction of new state homes along Harvard Place begins

Moyle Park

- » Construction of new homes along Bader Drive (next to Mangere College) begins
- » First Stage 1 affordable & market houses completed along Cessna Place
- » Construction of widened walkway from Watchfield Close to Moyle Park

A NEW WALKWAY COMING HERE SOON

As part of the Mangere Development, we

are improving connections around the neighbourhood,

including access to open spaces. We're excited that there will soon be a new

walkway between Watchfield Close and Moyle Park. The new walkway will provide a safer, wider and more visible path between the park and the neighbouring area. While the work is taking place, there is a temporary walkway for you to use.

A second walkway is planned for construction from Elmdon Street to Welby Place, this will be wider, and include native planting and street lighting. While the work is taking place the existing walkway will be closed.
