Ventura Street Community Viewing Days a Success

Fifteen state homes on Ventura Street, the first to be built as part of the Mangere West Development, were completed ahead of schedule late this October. So before the new tenants moved into their brand new homes, Kāinga Ora's urban development team held two community viewing days on Friday 1 November and Saturday 2 November, and with huge success.

The community turned out in numbers on both days, with around sixty people visiting on the first day, and forty on the second. Day one kicked-off with an official opening and dawn blessing to acknowledge the hard work that has gone into the building of these new homes and preparing them for the whānau who'll be moving into them.

The new homes on Ventura Street are two-storied terraced houses, ranging in size from three, four and five-bedrooms. Each home comes with a garden shed and planter beds, so that tenants can start growing their own vegetables from the moment they move in.

Albert Wipani, the Mangere West Community Development and Engagement Coordinator was present on both days, meeting and greeting locals who came to visit the new homes.

"People wanted to see for themselves what these new homes look and feel like, both inside and out," says Albert. "Everyone was really impressed with the quality, and many of them commented on how spacious the rooms were, and in particular, the staircases."



Spotless and Kāinga Ora launched the cadetship programme in July 2018 to give local students invaluable work experience under the supervision and mentorship of Spotless staff. The most recent programme - and the last for the 2019 calendar year - ran over the October school holidays, attracting students from Auckland Seventh - Day Adventist High School, Mt Albert School, Southern Cross High School and De La Salle College.

The cadets received certificates at a special ceremony on Friday 18 October in recognition of their hard work. The ceremony was attended by representatives from the schools, Community Connector for Mangere - John Kumitau, Nick Davidson - General Manager at Spotless the Mangere Development Team and Councillor Alf Filipaina.






Mangere West Development progress update

Stage 1 of the development is well underway. The building of the new state homes on the corner of Bader Drive and McKenzie Road have an anticipated completion date of early next year, while some state houses on Bader Drive and Ventura Street are already complete. Tenants on Ventura Street have already moved into their new homes.

The first market and affordable homes to be built as part of Stage 1 will begin in the first half of next year following the completion of civil construction work at the end of this year.

Stage 2 will commence in the new year with civil works and tenant rehousing, followed by demolition of the old state houses. Stage 2 will see a further 195 healthy homes delivered, 62 of which will be new warm, dry state homes and 133 of which will be market and more affordable homes.





TIMELINE

Summer 2019/20

Civil works for Stage 1 continue.

First state homes on Ventura Street/Bader Drive and Bader Drive/McKenzie Road complete.

Autumn 2020

Construction of 19 new apartment units on Ventura Street/Bader Drive begins.

Tenant rehousing for Stage 2 begins

Construction of first market and more affordable homes begins.

Demolition of old state house and civil works for Stage 2 commences.

Winter 2020

Construction of more market and affordable homes for Stage 1 begins.

Spring 2020

Construction of first Stage 1 state homes along Harvard Place begins.
